Under the guidance of Dr. Monika Rastogi, IIMT College of Law submitted total 13 ideas for the Competition which was organized by Government of India. It was for all the Higher Educational Institutions.

Many students participated and various ideas were submitted through web portal. Students came out with very interesting ideas on how they could innovate little toys with available knowledge on basic requirements of making toys. Students came out with the idea of use of natural and sustainable toys that would be cost effective and safer from the point of view of children. Our students suggested toys for children of different ages, keeping in mind that each child develops at an individual pace and that requirement of different age is different. We divided students into teams, each team consisting of 3 students each and two faculty members as Mentors for guidance. In this way we submitted 13 ideas in total.

Students participate in moot court processing and argue cases in front of judges. The moot court is a replica of courtroom scenario in reality. A moot court competition simulates a court hearing in which participants analyse a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument. IIMT College of Law has

successfully organized Intra-Moot Court Competition on 25th January 2021. The aim of this activity is that student have to practice about cases as advocates and search more relevant evidences as well as the facts of the case and also search the case related matters which provide the strength to the case. After completion of the activity students were able to : Identify each potentially applicable legal theory as it relates to the facts; Identify each legal rule relevant to each potentially applicable legal theory; and Identify the legally significant facts relating to each applicable legal rule.

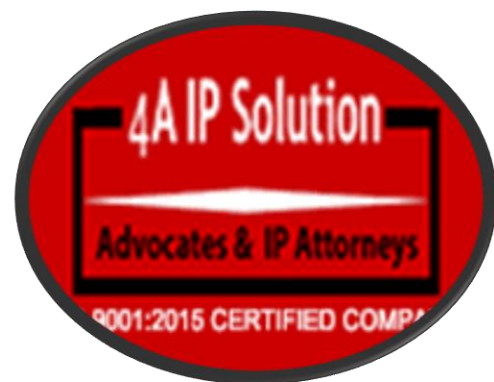

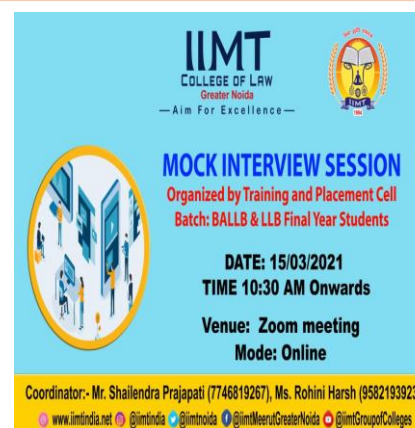
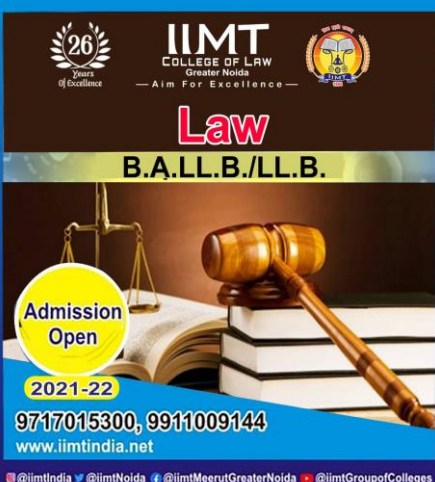
TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

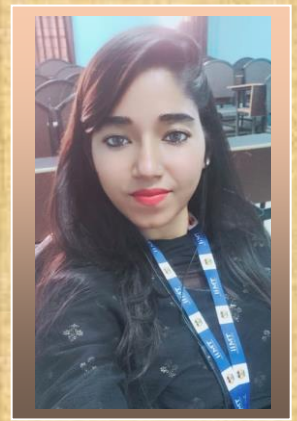
LEGAL VISIT

Special case-

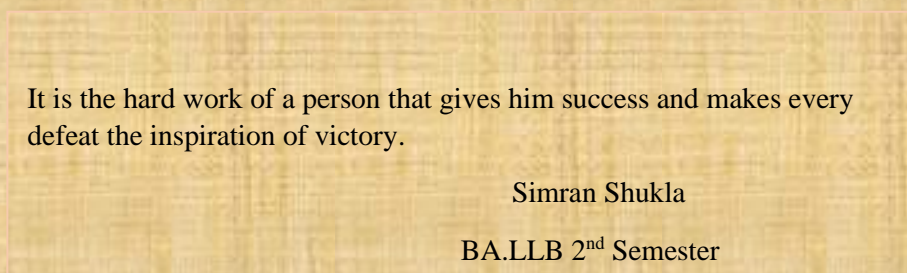
A person who is usually of unsound mind but is sometimes of sound mind, may make a contract when he is of a sound mind.
