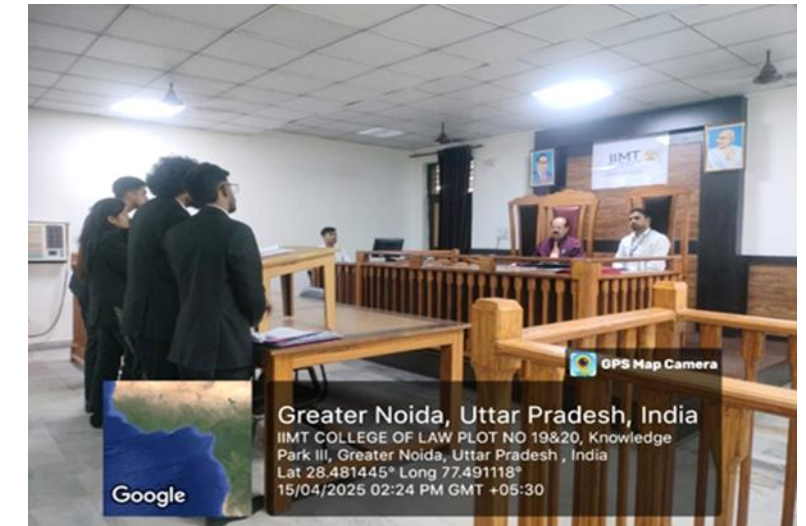
stories, and practical tips for overcoming challenges and seizing opportunities after the competitions.

## Parliamentary Debate:

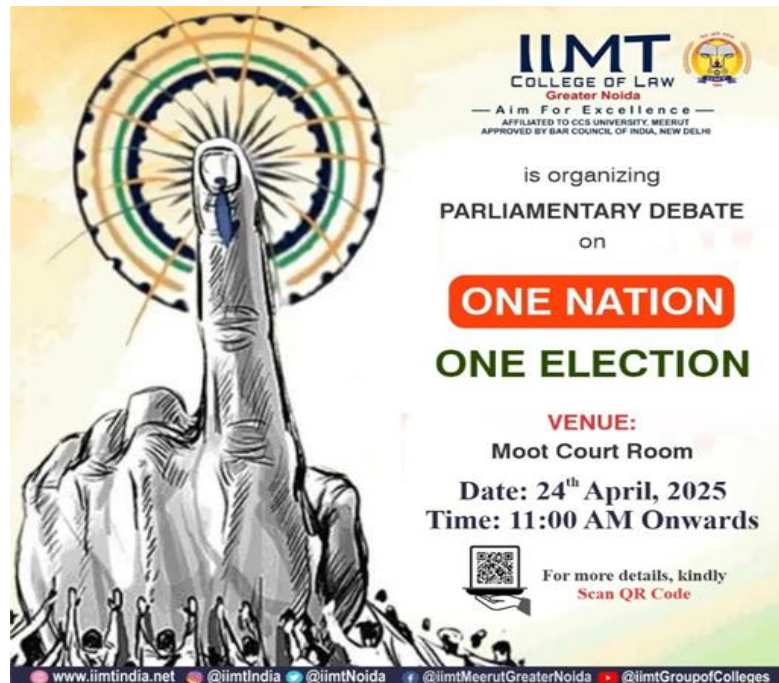

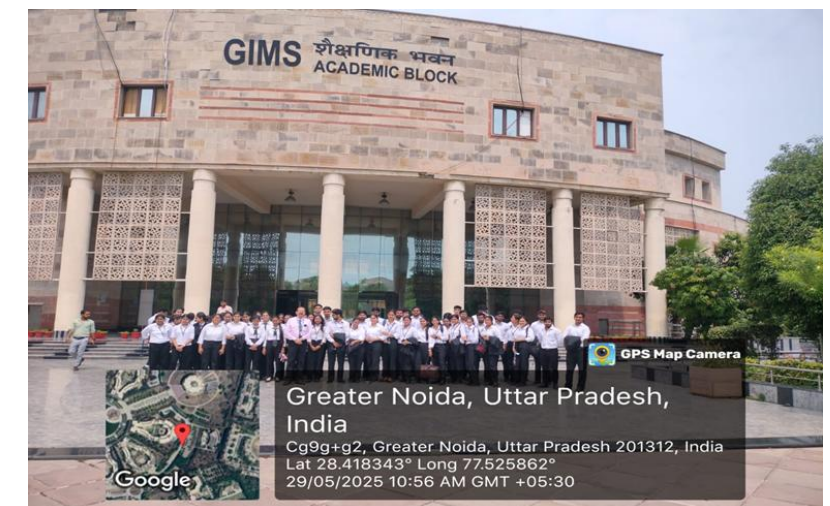


Entrepreneurship needs innovative talents, which are an important driving force for future development of the nation. A law student can start any kind of business they so desire related to their field of expertise.

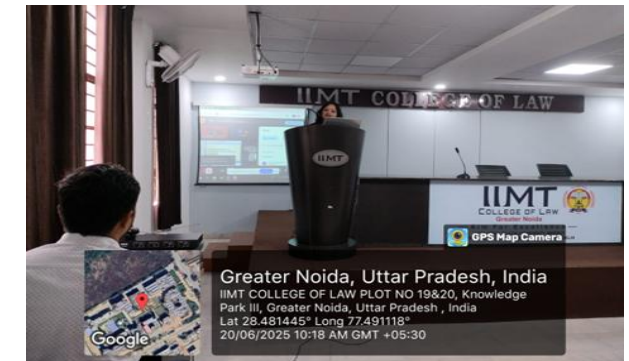
Day 3:

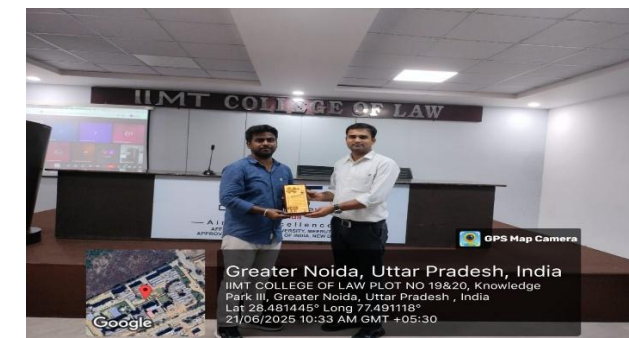
Day 4:

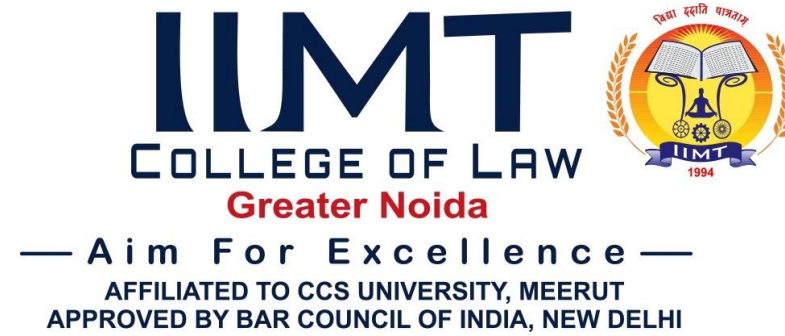
## Faculty Appreciation for Teaching Excellence
