

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


INSPIRATIONAL LECTURE ON HOW TO DEVELOP ENTREPRENEURSHIP SKILLS

GUEST LECTURE ON TRIAL BY MEDIA



IIMT College of Law organsied guest lecture on "**TRIAL BY MEDIA**". The guest speaker for the event was Dr. Vaishali Arora who is designated as Associate Professor at Sharda School of Law.

She quoted Eminent American autho, Thomas Sowell who dismissed the conventional notion advocating that, "When your case is weak, shout louder" and instead, propagates a thought that evidently communicates the colossal power media commands in the arena of judicial proceedings. He appositely remarks, "When your case is weak, take it to the media, instead of to the Courts".

She explained 'Trial by Media by referencing R.K. Anand v. Registrar, Delhi High Court [(2009) 8 SCC 106] where it was held that the impact of television and newspaper coverage on a person's reputation by creating a widespread perception of guilt regardless of any verdict in a court of law".

Vaishali Ma'am highlighted the use of a media trial:


1. Prejudicial Impact on a free and fair trial.

2. Unwarranted intrusion into the implied fundamental rights of privacy and dignity.

3. Violation of certain indispensable legal principles including, principles of natural justice viz., 'presumption of innocence until proven guilty', 'guilt must be proved beyond reasonable doubt', the right not to be compelled to be a witness against oneself and;

5. Hostile Witnesses: Undue pressure on the lawyers to not take up cases of accused-accused goes to trial without any defense.

GUEST LECTURE ON THE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR AN ADVOCATE



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IIMT College of Law conducted a guest lecture on "THE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR AN ADVOCATE" from 02:00 PM onwards at Ambedkar Hall. The resource person was Adv. (Col.) Jagdish Prasad, who is currently practising at Delhi High Court. The guest discussed 33 points about the code of conduct that are considered ethically important for lawyers. The lecture was very informative and thoughtprovoking as it described the difference between ethical and legal aspects of advocacy. The speaker said that an advocate is an officer of the court. So, he has to follow etiquette and abide by the law. An advocate should not try to influence the decision of the court. An advocate should not represent the case of the client, who uses unfair means or unethical approaches. It was also mentioned during the session that an advocate should not use abusive language in court. Adv. Jagdish Prasad added that they should provide appropriate assistance to the court and foster public trust in the court. It is also said that communications between the client and the Advocate are not to be revealed at any time. They are protected by attorney-client privilege. It is immoral for an advocate to hide any relevant facts or evidence. If doing so, it may result in an unjust sentence to an innocent person. An essential component of the legal profession is the conduct of advocates. A code of ethics for advocates is established by the Advocates Act of 1961. It contains guidelines for how they should conduct themselves in court, with clients, and in public. Students raised various questions regarding the actual process and etiquette during court proceedings which were aptly answered by the guest. Students and faculty came forward to enrich the session and lead it towards success.


SOCIAL CLUB ACTIVITY

Does Data Collection by Authorities and Organizations is a Privacy Intrusion?

IIMT College of Law organised a Minor Activity named **"DEBATE COMPETITION"** on 8th May 2023 from 03:10 PM onwards. Under this activity, students of the Law department participated. The topic of the debate was "Does Data Collection by Authorities and Organisations a Privacy Intrusion? The students were supposed to speak for and against the topic. Amongst the 10 contestants, few spoke in favour of the topic, and few spoke against the topic. The first speaker named Jyoti while favouring the topic contented that Data protection is one of the most important parts of the right to privacy as a data protection law will protect your personal information, which is collected, processed, and stored by automated means or intended to be part of a filing system.

Unlike the European Union, India does not have any separate law which is designed exclusively for data protection. However, the courts on several occasions have interpreted data protection within the ambit of Right to Privacy as implicit in Articles 19 and 21 of the Constitution of India.

Further another student named Shashank stated that both the government and service providers collect personal data. This adds to the danger of data leakage. Privacy is protection from possible abuses of personal information or searches by the state, while Data Protection is the tool the law uses to make sure that an individual is protected from abuse of his personal information by another individual. Along with him, student named Vatsal stated Article 21 protects the right to privacy and promotes the dignity of the individual.
